### **BREAST CANCER AWARENESS CAMPAIGN**







During the month of October, Raleigh Alumnae's F.O.C.U.S. Taskforce partnered with Poplar Springs Church and Studio 113 to launch a campaign to increase awareness of the #1 killer among African American women.

Owner of Studio 113 and a proud member of Raleigh Alumnae, Michelle Merritt-Tucker,

hosted a display at her salon highlighting literature on Black women getting breast cancer at a slightly lower incidence rate (3%) than white women, but are 42% more likely not to survive. More advanced stages at diagnosis among black women have been largely attributed to issues related to lack of



awareness access to high-quality health care - including fewer screening mammograms, lack of timely follow-up of abnormal results, and receipt of health care at lower resourced or non-accredited facilities. Even one preventable death is too many!


